

U.S. Government Assistance to Panama during COVID-19



Nearly \$1 million in health related assistance

This funding, provided by Congress, will help Panama continue to combat, mitigate, and monitor the pandemic.



The COVID-19 assistance to-date from the State Department and USAID includes:

- 🌐 **Help address the outbreak in Panama.** Assistance, via Population Services International, will optimize country health system capacity to contain and monitor COVID-19, protecting the most vulnerable.
- 🌐 **More than \$100,000 to the Security Services and Customs.** These funds provided the National Police, the Border Service, the Air and Naval Service, and the Migration and Customs agencies with cleaning supplies, uniforms, and disinfectant units for the safe treatment of vehicles, equipment, and offices.
- 🌐 **Nearly \$45,000 to the Ministry of Health (MINSA)** in medical supplies to mitigate and protect health officials from the virus.
- 🌐 **Nearly \$30,000 to the Border Service (SENAFRONT)** to protect Panama. These funds provided supplies to the border regions to help contain the virus.
- 🌐 **Nearly \$15,000 to the Fire Department** in medical supplies to help mitigate the virus.
- 🌐 **\$10,000 in humanitarian assistance to communities.** From USAID's Office of Foreign Disaster Assistance, these funds provided disinfectant and medical supplies to the Commission for Risk Management and Community Development from the Association of Municipalities of Panama (AMUPA).
